LAST YEAR'S WINNER: TRUESHAN

After winning the Qatar Prix du Cadran at Longchamp just a fortnight prior to QIPCO British Champions Day, superstar stayer Trueshan made it back-to-back victories in the QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup. The Alan King-trained colt showed his class by beating the likes of the legendary Stradivarius, to become the third horse to win at multiple QIPCO British Champions Day after Frankel (2011 and 2012) and Magical (2018 and 2019). Jockey Hollie Doyle rode a similar race to the 2020 renewal, sitting midfield throughout before exploding into life in the final few furlongs, showing Trueshan's true speed. The pair extended their lead in the closing stages and won by a comfortable one and a half lengths from Tashkhan in second, with Stradivarius back in third. Can Trueshan make history in 2022 by becoming the first horse to win at three QIPCO British Champions Days?



POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR INCLUDE

COLTRANE Trainer: Andrew Balding Age: 5



The tough and game Coltrane has already given his owners, Mick and Janice Mariscotti, a fabulous year. Beaten a neck when runner-up in the tote+ Chester Cup on his return, he then went one better in the Ascot Stakes at Royal Ascot before running away with the Coral Marathon at Sandown Park. Those efforts encouraged his connections to raise him in grade and he has not let them down, making the frame in the Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup (fourth to Kyprios) and Weatherbys Hamilton Lonsdale Cup (second to Quickthorn) before landing the Coral Doncaster Cup, by a neck from Trueshan. Coltrane's progress is reflected by the fact that his official ratings has risen 18lb this season. He seems versatile regards underfoot conditions.

TRUESHAN Trainer: Alan King Age: 6



Trueshan seeks to make history by becoming the first horse to win three times on QIPCO British Champions Day. A runaway winner of this race two years ago, he retained his crown in decisive fashion 12 months ago and seems unlikely to relinquish it without a fight. He looked better than ever when winning the Northumberland Plate at Newcastle in June, when conceding lumps of weight to his rivals, and has subsequently been placed in the Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup and Coral Doncaster Cup. He let down odds-on backers in the latter but the muddling tempo didn't bring all his stamina into play. His ten wins on turf have all been achieved on good ground or softer, so any give in the ground will aid his cause.

ELDAR ELDAROV Trainer: Roger Varian Age: 3



A three-year-old has yet to win the QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup but perhaps Eldar Eldarov will put the record straight. He was having only his third start when performing wonders to get up in the final stride of the Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot in June and stayed on strongly to win the Cazoo St Leger at Doncaster on his latest start. His only defeat in five races came on his penultimate start when he dropped in trip and was a creditable fourth to Onesto in the Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp in mid-July. He remains capable of better yet, especially as he is being unleashed over two miles for the first time. "He could be a very exciting Cup horse for the next season and beyond," says his trainer.



POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR INCLUDE

CREATIVE FORCE Trainer: Charlie Appleby Age: 4



No horse has won the QIPCO British Champions Sprint Stakes in successive years, although 2020 winner Glen Shiel came close to achieving the feat when runner-up last year. Creative Force was the horse who denied him the double and now seeks back-to-back triumphs himself. He was a convincing winner 12 months ago, having won four other races earlier in the campaign, including in the Jersey Stakes at Royal Ascot. We've not seen so much of Creative Force this season but he's shown all his powers remain intact, being beaten just a neck by Naval Crown, his stablemate, in the Platinum Jubilee Stakes here in June before finishing fourth in the Darley July Cup (a place better than he managed in 2021). Having had only 13 races, he remains low mileage and possibly capable of better yet.

ART POWER Trainer: Tim Easterby Age: 5



Art Power has run in six QIPCO British Champions Sprint Stakes races over 6f in the past couple of years and finished 443454; never being beaten far on any occasion. His connections must have been growing a little concerned that their grey might never hit the jackpot but an emphatic win on his latest start in the Group 3 William Hill Ireland Renaissance Stakes at The Curragh means he will arrive at the top of the game. Art Power's record at Ascot stands close inspection. He's been a fine fourth in the past two renewals of this race – last year when drawn away from the trio who beat him – plus has twice run well at Royal Ascot, winning at the meeting in 2020 and finishing third in last year's Diamond Jubilee Stakes.

ROHAAN Trainer: David Evans Age: 4



Rohaan was disappointing in the Sprint last year but perhaps a fruitful year, during which he won seven of his 17 races, had caught up with him. His prowess at Ascot is certainly not in doubt as he has won the past two renewals of the Wokingham, beating an aggregate of 45 rivals from high in the weights. And a fortnight ago he returned to land the Group 3 John Guest Racing Bengough Stakes.

Rohaan made the frame in two Group 1 races in the second half of the summer – the Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville (behind Highfield Princess) and Betfair Sprint Cup (behind Minzaal) at Haydock. He's in his element when pouncing late in strongly-run races, and seems effective on all types of going.

LAST YEAR'S WINNER: ESHAADA

A dramatic finish in the QIPCO British Champions Fillies and Mares Stakes saw the Roger Varian-trained Eshaada head-bobbing to victory ahead of Albaflora. Ridden by Jim Crowley, the pair sat comfortably throughout the race, travelling the best out of the field of eight. When turning into the home straight Eshaada was sat on the bridle in third, looking the likely winner from that stage. She showed her class when leading two furlongs out and battled hard alongside Rossa Ryan and Albaflora to emerge victorious. The 8/11 favourite Snowfall only managed to finish third, three and-a-half lengths behind the winner.



POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR INCLUDE

EMILY UPJOHN Trainer: John & Thady Gosden Age: 3



Emily Upjohn slips in somewhat under the radar, having been absent since a disappointing run in the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes here at Ascot almost three months ago. However, her efforts in the first half of the season make her a leading contender for a prize her stable has scooped twice since 2016. Emily Upjohn romped home by 9½ lengths on her return at Sandown and was making it three wins from three starts when also a wide-margin winner of the Tattersalls Musidora Stakes at York. She might well have won the Cazoo Oaks at Epsom, too, but for a stumble at the start putting her on the backfoot. In a dramatic finish, she was beaten a short head.

MIMIKYU Trainer: John & Thady Gosden Age: 3



Veteran owner-breeder George Strawbridge saw his distinctive white and green silks carried to victory by the John Gosden-trained Journey in this race in 2016 and must be hopeful of repeating the feat with her sister, Mimikyu, who has been blessed with similar powers and is also housed at Clarehaven. She was having only her sixth start when an emphatic winner of the Park Hill Fillies' Stakes at Doncaster last time when settling better than she has done sometimes in the past and scoring at the main expense of Eshaada, winner of this race last year. A first-time hood seemed to help Mimikyu relax at Town Moor last time and perhaps it is no coincidence that the same headgear also helped Journey fulfil her potential six years ago.

ESHAADA Trainer: Roger Varian Age: 4



Eshaada edged home by a short head from Albaflora in a thrilling renewal of the QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares last year and is back to defend her crown. She had been runner-up in the Ribblesdale Stakes at Royal Ascot four months earlier and the demands of this course clearly serve her well, much as they did her sire, Muhaarar, who was all about speed and won the Commonwealth Cup and Champions Sprint at Ascot in 2015. Eshaada has been unable to add to her tally in three starts this term but has run well in defeat on her past two starts. She finished third to Free Wind in the bet365 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock and then chased home Mimikyu in the Coral Park Hill Fillies' Stakes Doncaster.

The unbeaten Baaeed added to his winning streak by beating the market leader Palace Pier in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (sponsored by QIPCO). Jockey Jim Crowley trailed Frankie Dettori aboard Palace Pier throughout the race, both travelling well against a competitive field, with Dettori looking round to see where Crowley and Baaeed were. The pair strode clear of the pack in the final half furlong, but it was Baaeed that showed he was truly something special, displaying a wonderful combination of power and pace to comfortably win by a neck. Now the highest-rated racehorse in the world on turf, will he follow in the footsteps of Frankel by winning this year's QIPCO Champion Stakes and ending his career unbeaten?



POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR:

INSPIRAL Trainer: John & Thady Gosden Age: 3



Ten years after the mighty Frankel signed off his career with another win on QIPCO British Champions Day, several of his offspring are in action today – not least Inspiral, who has inherited plenty of her Dad's talent. Unbeaten in four starts last season, when crowned champion two-year-old filly, she won the Coronation Stakes at Royal Ascot by almost five lengths on her return this June and was winning at the highest level for the third time when taking the Jacques le Marois at Deauville on her latest start. Her only defeat came in between, when runner-up in the Tattersalls Falmouth Stakes at Newmarket. John Gosden attributed that defeat to the race coming too soon after her Ascot exploits but that won't be an issue this afternoon after a two-month break.

MODERN GAMES Trainer: Charlie Appleby Age: 3



Modern Games had the distinction of winning last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Del Mar after temporarily being withdrawn minutes before the start and his eventful story has included more glorious chapters around the globe this year. The chestnut colt won the Mirates Poule D'Essai Des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) on his return at Longchamp and on his latest start he ventured to Canada and scooped the Ricoh Woodbine Mile. In between, he beat all bar Baaeed in the Qatar Sussex Stakes at Goodwood. The son of Dubawi is already pencilled in for a return to America for another Breeders' Cup assignment next month but first he will attempt to win a fourth race at the highest level in a fourth country. It goes without saying he has a wonderful temperament.

THE REVENANT Trainer: Francis-Henri Graffard Age: 7



The Revenant will need no introduction to QIPCO British Champions Day regulars as the French-trained challenger has become a standing dish in this race. Runner-up to King Of Change in the 2019 renewal, he went one better 12 months later when too strong for Roseman and Palace Pier. Last year, he again gave his all to finish a close fourth to the outstanding Baaeed – one of only two occasions in his 21-race career when he has finished outside the first three. As in previous years, The Revenant has warmed up for his date here by running in the Group 2 Qatar Prix Daniel Wildenstein a couple of weeks earlier at Longchamp. He looked on good terms with himself, chasing home the exciting Erevann.

LAST YEAR'S WINNER: SEALIWAY

A classy field battled it out in the QIPCO Champion Stakes, but it was the 12-1 French-trained Sealiway who stormed home to take the spoils. It was a first victory on QIPCO British Champions Day for French Classic-winning jockey Mickael Barzalona. Sealiway followed Cazoo Derby winner Adayar throughout the race, keeping a good position in midfield and travelling well. The pair led the pack in the home straight, with Saudi Cup winner Mishriff coming to challenge with two furlongs to go. Adayar couldn't quite keep up with the leaders and in the final furlong it was Sealiway who battled it out with Dubai Honour. Sealiway showed an impressive turn of foot and finished strongly, winning by three quarters of a length. It maintained France's excellent record in the headline race at QIPCO British Champions Day, with Sealiway following in the footsteps of Cirrus des Aigles (2011) and Almanzor (2016).



POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR INCLUDE:

BAAEED Trainer: William Haggas Age: 4



All-conquering Baaeed is the headline at this year's QIPCO British Champions Day. Unbeaten in ten starts, his connections have said this will be the outstanding colt's final race before he is retired to stud. He signed off last year with victory in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes on QIPCO British Champions Day and this season has reeled off four more Group 1 wins, winning them by an aggregate of more than 13 lengths under regular rider Jim Crowley. The son of Sea The Stars won the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes in effortless fashion on his return before landing the Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot. Next came a fluent success in the Qatar Sussex Stakes at Goodwood before a step up in trip and an imperious 6½-length success in the Juddmonte International at York, all part of the QIPCO British Champions Series. He's a magnificent horse and will be a short price to bow out in style.

DUBAI HONOUR Trainer: William Haggas Age: 4



Most of the focus building up the QIPCO Champion Stakes has naturally been on the outstanding Baaeed but William Haggas, his trainer, has a smart second string to his bow to Dubai Honour. This colt made tremendous strides through last year and looked like he might win this race last year, only to find Sealiway a bit too strong in the closing stages. Dubai Honour also ran a tremendous race when a fourth in the Longines Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin, a couple of months later, and he has continued to run well this season without quite getting his head in front. He lost out by a nose in the Sky Bet York Stakes and also finished second on his most recent start in the Unibet September Stakes at Kempton Park.

ADAYAR Trainer: Charlie Appleby Age: 4



Last year's emphatic Cazoo Derby winner seems likely to ensure Baaeed does not have things all his own way this afternoon. He followed up his triumph in the premier Classic at Epsom last year by winning the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes here at Ascot before finishing a gallant fourth in the 2021 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Adayar was possibly not over those exertions when below-par in this race 13 days later but freshness will not be a problem today as he only made his 2022 return at Doncaster last month. He was not extended to beat two inferior rivals that day, going about his business with relish. It should have put him spot-on for his much tougher assignment.

POSSIBLE CONTENDERS THIS YEAR:

ESCOBAR Trainer: David O'Meara Age: 8



Escobar will be running on QIPCO British Champions Day for the fifth successive year and few will take him lightly after his commanding win in a valuable handicap at Ascot a fortnight ago. That success confirmed he seems to have a soft spot for Ascot, which is also reflected by his record in this race. Second in the 2018 renewal, he went one better 12 months later, when winning at the main expense of subsequent Group 1 winner Lord North, and he was a creditable sixth last year. He is well-served by the demands of big-field handicaps and the dartboard colours of his owners make him easy to identify. They will be hoping for another bullseye from him.

MONTASSIB Trainer: William Haggas Age: 4



Montassib has been knocking at the door so loudly in competitive handicaps in the second half of this season that he probably has bruised knuckles. Having returned from a lengthy lay-off with successive wins at Wetherby and Goodwood, he was then a close fifth in the Buckingham Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot before fourth-place finishes in the bet365 Bunbury Cup, at Newmarket, and Dubai Duty Free Shergar Mile, here at Ascot. On his latest start, he found one too good at Haydock Park, again hinting his turn was close. Haggas is seeking a second successive Balmoral win, having won last year's renewal with Aldaary.

MIGRATION Trainer: David Menuisier Age: 6



Migration has been absent since being beaten a neck by Modern News in a competitive 17-runner handicap at Newbury in April but he can go well when fresh, so don't let that put you off him. Last season, having returned from 20 months on the sidelines, he was an unlucky loser on his return at Salisbury before winning at Glorious Goodwood and then scoring at York's Dante meeting. He was a well-backed favourite on each occasion, as he had been on his comeback. His trainer attributed his below-par final run of the campaign to fast ground and his overall record does point to good going or softer serving him well. His Newbury conqueror won a Listed race next time and went close in Group 3 company on his latest start.

CHAMPION JOCKEY 2022 WILLIAM BUICK

The Flat Jockeys' Championship is not an honorary gong, a bauble bestowed at the season's end, but a title earned through blood, sweat and tears. It is testament to the determination, character and talent of William Buick that having finished runner-up in the last two gruelling campaigns, that he was fully prepared to do it all again.

The 34-year-old gave it his all in 2021, a year in which he could have been forgiven for focusing on quality over quantity in a campaign that yielded a host of big-race successes, including the Cazoo St Leger on Hurricane Lane and the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes aboard Adayar.

But Buick's agent Tony Hind made it clear from an early stage this year that his appetite for honours, along with the rider's, was as voracious as ever.

"I have got this thing in my blood that I love making champions," Hind said. "I am going to go for it from start to finish with William. He has got a lot of good contacts, he is a brilliant jockey, and has got all the attributes to be champion."

Those attributes now have affirmation, if any were needed, in the form of a first Flat Jockeys' Championship for Buick. It's hard to believe it will be his last.

It seems an age ago that Buick shared the 2008 apprentices' title with David Probert when both were based with Andrew Balding at Kingsclere, a yard which has also helped launch the careers of last year's champion Oisin Murphy and 2010 champion apprentice Jason Watson - and which houses one of this year's leading apprentice jockeys in Harry Davies.

Balding's father, Ian, was so taken with Buick's ability that he struck a £10 bet at 500/1 that Buick would be champion by 2020, remarkably placed before the jockey had ridden in public.

Towards the end of 2014, Godolphin signed up both Buick and his close friend James Doyle; their careers remain closely entwined, with Doyle gaining a first British Classic success in the QIPCO 2000 Guineas in April of this year aboard Coroebus, at the expense of Buick who had elected to ride stablemate Native Trail.

Buick and Native Trail gained some compensation in the Tattersalls Irish 2,000 Guineas before the pair finished a close third behind Vadeni and Mishriff in the Coral-Eclipse, one of the races of the season.

Buick was back on board Coroebus at Royal Ascot, guiding him to success in the St James's Palace Stakes, one of five victories for the rider at the prestigious meeting.

Despite that first start to the first six weeks of the campaign, this year's title was no all-the-way success for Buick, who was headed by both Hollie Doyle and Ben Curtis at points during the opening skirmishes.

A gifted rider unfairly dogged by injury, Curtis's season has again been interrupted by battles with a longstanding shoulder problem. All racing fans will hope that he is able to put those issues behind him and return in 2023 to enjoy a smoother season.

As for Doyle, her achievements require no further introduction. This year saw further holes punched in the glass ceiling as she gained a first Classic success in the French Oaks on Nashwa, days after finishing third in the Epsom version on the same filly.





She finishes the campaign with her best-ever seasonal tally, battling it out for second place in the championship with husband Tom Marquand and Paul Mulrennan, whose impressive level stakes profit over the course of the campaign has ensured that his popularity with punters endures.

Another six successes at the Qatar Goodwood Festival saw Buick retain the meeting's top jockey title and put the seal on a prolific period which saw him ride over 30 winners in both June and July and pull clear of his title race competitors.

The pace barely dropped in August, a month in which Buick brought up his fastest century, appropriately with a Newmarket double for Charlie Appleby in mid-month, prompting Appleby to say: "To get to 100 winners in the speed that he's done it in is an achievement in itself and I am delighted to be a part of it.

"It's not just his achievements here in the UK, it's what he does on the global stage as well, and it just shows the horsemanship and the talent that William has. But to be crowned Champion Jockey will be a great achievement, and myself and everyone at Godolphin are very pleased for him."

As Appleby highlighted, Buick rides for a worldwide operation and some of this year's biggest highlights have been on the international stage.

Buick won the French 2000 Guineas aboard Modern Games (and the following day was back at Redcar for six rides) who has been a star for stable and jockey this season, placing in the French Derby and Sussex Stakes before winning the Woodbine Mile to complete a Grade One double in Canada for the jockey.

Just days later, Newmarket's important Cambridgeshire meeting saw further success.

Buick ended the first day with a treble which he supplemented 24 hours later with a double and then another treble on the Saturday, including a Group One when landing the Cheveley Park Stakes aboard Ralph Beckett's Lezoo, highlighting his popularity with all trainers - at the time of writing, Buick had ridden domestic winners for 36 different trainers in the calendar year at an impressive strike rate of 27%.

Buick wasn't done there though and Sunday saw him in Germany, again in Group One-winning action, when he partnered Rebel's Romance to beat German Derby winner Sammarco in the Preis von Europa.

It is a relentless schedule, especially for a man with a young family, but dedication and a drive to succeed have carried Buick to the top and we can be certain that he will not rest on the laurels of being crowned Champion Jockey today.

CHAMPION OWNER 2022 GODOLPHIN

"For Godolphin to be Champion Owner, me Champion Trainer and William (Buick) being two strides off being Champion Jockey that shows the strength and depth of the operation and long may that continue," said Charlie Appleby at the end of 2021. "The hardest point now is to try to maintain this level in 2022, but we have an exciting team with some very smart soon-to-be three-year-olds."

Appleby's faith was not to prove misplaced. Those threeyear-olds had collected three Classics between them before the dust had settled on the new British season.

So, although the destination of this year's trainers' title will take a little more unravelling, Godolphin and Buick will be crowned Champion Owner and Champion Jockey following a season which began in scintillating fashion on Newmarket's Rowley Mile at the end of April (a month which had already seen Godolphin named UK Champion Owner on the all-weather for an eighth consecutive time).

Native Trail was unbeaten in his juvenile career and went into the winter as favourite for the QIPCO 2000 Guineas following his victory in the Dewhurst. Also successful on the same 2021 Dubai Future Champions Festival card was Coroebus, a convincing winner of the Group Three Emirates Autumn Stakes.

Buick - and the betting market - preferred Native Trail to Coroebus, but the latter produced a brilliant display to beat his stablemate by three quarters of a length and spark dreams of what lay ahead.

Those dreams didn't pan out as we all would have hoped with Coroebus suffering an untimely and fatal injury in the Prix du Moulin, having already added the St James's Palace Stakes to his tally, ending his career with four victories from seven starts.

Godolphin enjoyed a fine June, saddling 32 winners with a strike rate of 25%, and winning the Leading Owner Award at Royal Ascot for a second successive year with five victories over as many days. There was more top-level success too, courtesy both of Coroebus, and Naval Crown, who edged out stablemate Creative Force in a thrilling Platinum Jubilee Stakes.

The pair finished first and second at the same meeting in the Group Three Jersey Stakes 12 months earlier and repeated the feat against some of the leading sprinters in the world, with Naval Crown emerging best by a neck to become the 50th individual Group One winner for his sire, Dubawi. Noble Truth ensured that the Jersey Stakes remained with Godolphin and that success was further supplemented by Dubai Future (Wolferton) and Secret State (King George V Handicap).



Mawj, trained by Appleby's Godolphin colleague Saeed bin Suroor, finished second in the Albany Stakes but she went one better at Newmarket's July Festival in the Group Two Duchess of Cambridge Stakes and returned to Newmarket in September to finish third in the Group One Cheveley Park Stakes.

She was joined in the July Course winner's enclosure by the globe-trotting Yibir and New London, who gave a sign of things to come when storming home to win a heritage handicap. New London successfully stepped up in grade for the Group Three John Pearce Racing Gordon Stakes, putting himself in the frame for the Cazoo St Leger. Secret State also threw his hat into the ring for the final Classic of the season as the pair helped Godolphin end the Qatar Goodwood Festival as Champion Owner with six winners.

Godolphin ended July with another impressive haul of 30 winners at a 28% strike-rate and continued to send out winners at a similar rate throughout August and September with notable highlights provided by Noble Style's victory in the Gimcrack Stakes and by fellow juvenile Naval Power showcasing his talents in the Ascendant Stakes.

There are still races to be run and new champions to be crowned, but the race for the Owners' Championship was over bar the shouting, some time ago. At the very top of the sport, racing's wheel never stops turning.

THE 2022 APPRENTICE JOCKEYS' CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE RACE BENOIT DE LA SAYETTE VS HARRY DAVIES





The 2022 Apprentice Jockeys' Championship has been a relentless rollercoaster of a ride. Given the precocity and obvious talent of Benoit De La Sayette and Harry Davies, the racing world hoped the title battle between them might deliver. They were not to be disappointed. The pair have gone hammer and tongs, tooth and nail to the finishing line, trying to outfox each other up, down and across country from Kempton evening meeting to Haydock in the rain.

Such has been the close-knit rivalry of the pair that the Championship is yet to be decided – with just a handful of winners separating De La Sayette and Davies at this stage.

Whatever the successful ingredient to the triumphal concoction, October has seen Benoit De La Sayette, 19, edge into a marginal lead with just a few days of the Championship remaining.

It seems a long time ago that the championship began, back at the end of April. The first few weeks saw the chance for Davies to get first run on his would-be rival, as De La Sayette had only just returned from a six-month suspension.

Davies, 17, struck first, scoring on sprinter Son Of Sannie just three days into the season. Both he and Saffie Osborne raced into an early lead, their confidence up and the thrill of a new campaign spurring them on.

It didn't take long for De La Sayette to throw his hat in the ring, though – and, as we have come to expect, he did it in the cheekiest way possible. Taking the ride on Vafortino in one of the biggest handicaps of the season, the Victoria Cup, he steered the four-year-old gelding home for a cosy victory.

Once again, just as he had demonstrated when winning the Lincoln a season earlier, De La Sayette proved himself a man for the big occasion. However, you can't keep a talented rider down for long, and Davies soon responded. Donning the blue silks of Godolphin, he bounced straight back with victory aboard After The Rain in the very next race.

Perhaps this was an early auspice of what was to come. Just when De La Sayette might have thought he'd stolen a march on his rival, so Davies hit back. It would be tit for tat throughout the summer. Indeed, just a week after the Victoria Cup, Davies landed a big Saturday handicap at Newmarket aboard Shine So Bright. Despite a slow start,

Davies refused to panic and weaved his mount through rivals to land the prize, demonstrating composure and cool in the heat of the moment.

And another seven days later, Davies continued his surge, landing a double at York on Bronte Cup Day with Truly Aclaimed and Maywake. Time for his rival to panic? Of course not. Forty-eight hours after Davies' double, De La Sayette caressed Salvator Mundi home at Leicester for bosses John and Thady Gosden.

By the end of June, the standings saw Harry Davies on 20 winners, with Benoit De La Sayette on 19. Neither had given an inch thus far, and July would see more of the same. On the opening weekend, it was De La Sayette's turn to ride a double, with Leicester once again a happy hunting ground as Divine Magic and Dukedom both did the business.

Damaar helped him stretch the lead yet further at Chelmsford the following day, and it was at this point that De La Sayette really laid a marker down for the first time. Another winner at Brighton twenty-four hours later, and he was on a roll. The following Saturday he scored again, this time at Newmarket.

Three winners during Qatar Glorious Festival week followed, including a success aboard Trawlerman, who went on to triumph in the Ebor. But the best thrive under pressure, and Davies was keeping himself in the mix. A treble at Chelmsford at the beginning of August gave him a big boost, and suddenly it was game on again.

Another Saturday winner at Newmarket two weeks later, and once again there wasn't much in it at all. Come mid-September and the scores were Davies 48, De La Sayette 47. Too close to call.

Since then however, Benoit de la Sayette has had a month to remember. Over a dozen winners has seen his lead become a title. Racing should be grateful to both him and Davies as, apart from serving up an exciting battle, we now have two brilliant riding prospects to look forward to in the future.

Not that any racing championship – even this one – can only have been about two protagonists.

Saffie Osborne, Rhys Clutterbuck, Ryan Sexton, and Callum Hutchinson have all demonstrated that they have bright futures with notable successes against the biggest names, while Sean Kirrane, Stefano Cherchi, Pierre-Louis Jamin and Fred Larson have all also shown themselves to be hot prospects for the future.

Competition at the top is becoming stronger and that healthy sporting rivalry is cascading down to the apprentice ranks. Recent winners of this title include Cieren Fallon, Oisin Murphy and Tom Marquand, and all have gone on to great things. It would take someone brave to bet that Benoit De La Sayette is not destined for the same heights.

The QIPCO British Champions Series Hall of Fame inducts individuals, both equine and human, from 1970 to the present day and the Class of 2022 has already introduced equine Hall of Famers from both ends of the timeline.

Guineas Inductions

In April the Hall of Fame inducted two more titans of the turf, with Frankie Dettori and Dancing Brave becoming the tenth and eleventh Hall of Famers. Both titans were recognised at the QIPCO Guineas Festival and presented with their coveted Hall of Fame medals.

Frankie Dettori has been thrilling racing fans for 35 years and is a sporting colossus recognised by a global audience, and his story still has more chapters. Dettori has ridden almost 3,300 British winners and has also enjoyed vast success all around the world, winning major races in no fewer than 24 countries. His six victories in France's most coveted race, the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, is a record.

The Class of 2022 also wound back the clock to the early 1980s, with Dancing Brave becoming the sixth horse to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. His versatility and turn of foot, not to mention constitution, made him stand out from the crowd.

The Great Galileo

The seventh horse inducted into the Hall of Fame was the late great Galileo, who was recognised at the Cazoo Derby Festival following a public vote. Galileo was a dazzling Derby winner in 2001, and his progeny has continued to shine in the Classic race. The great stallion now joins his most successful progeny, the incomparable and all-conquering Frankel, in the Hall of Fame.

Saturday's Inductions

It was ten years ago this week that the late, magnificent colt, Frankel, signed off his flawless 14-race career with victory in the QIPCO Champion Stakes on this very raceday. Today we're celebrating his trainer, Sir Henry Cecil, one of the most successful and much-loved trainers of the past century. Speaking of his most celebrated masterpiece, Frankel, Cecil acclaimed; "He's the best I've ever had, the best I've ever seen."

Cecil is joined in the Hall of Fame by one of racing's colourful characters, Willie Carson OBE. Carson was a 5ft powerhouse of the Weighing Room and today, we recognise his glittering career by announcing his induction into the QIPCO British Champions Series Hall of Fame.

The Scot, who will be 80 next month, was Champion Jockey in Britain five times and his 3,828 winners in the UK have included 17 Classic triumphs, four of them in The Derby. Only three other greats have bettered his overall tally: Sir Gordon Richards (4870), Pat Eddery (4633) and Lester Piggott (4493).
